

Rules:

1. The management and staff of the horse show, and Leg Up Stables, Inc. will not be responsible for any accident or loss which may occur to any exhibitor, spectator, groom or animal at the show. Participants and spectators understand that horses are inherently unpredictable and dangerous and that equipment and ground conditions are equally unpredictable, yet knowingly choose to participate and/or spectate at this horse show, taking responsibility for this choice. Entry onto the grounds constitutes knowledge and agreement with this policy.
2. ASTM/SEI approved helmets must be worn at all times when mounted.
3. All exhibitors must possess a current negative Coggins test.
4. Entries will not be accepted without a signed entry form and release.
5. All dogs must be leashed at all times.
6. Ring breaks after jumping classes and English flat classes for ring preparation.

Hunter Class descriptions:

Short Stirrup: Open to junior riders 12 years of age and under. Riders may ride horses or ponies. Jumps Cross rails 18" - 2'

Beginner Equitation: Open to junior and amateur riders in their first year of showing. Fences 2'. No oxers permitted. Riders are eligible for one horse show year and may not enter divisions with fence heights exceeding 2'. To be judged on rider's position and control.

Baby Green Hunter: Open to horses only in their first or second year of showing over fences. Judged on performance, manners, and way of going. Fences cross rails 18"

Intermediate Hunter: Open to horses or ponies. Judged on performance, manners, and way of going. Fences 2'6".

Handy Hunter: A course in the ring of not less than 8 jumps open to horses or ponies; 2'9 to 3' with two changes of direction after the first jump and include least two of the following inside the course: a roll back turn, a broken or bending line, an end jump, a narrow jump, trotting fence, or a long ride to a single jump. Must have at least 6 in the class for payout.

Payout 30/20/10

Green Hunter: Open to horses only in their first or second year of showing over fences. Judged on performance, manners, and way of going. Fences 2'.

Hunter Class descriptions:

Novice Hunter: Open to horses or ponies. Judged on performance, manners, and way of going. Fences 2'3".

Children's/Junior Equitation Class. Open to juniors mounted on horses. The judges will select at least one-fourth of the class to show at a walk, trot, and canter and to perform additional tests at the judge's discretion.

Adult Equitation Class. Open to amateurs mounted on horses. The judges will select at least one-fourth of the class to show at a walk, trot, and canter and to perform additional tests at the judge's discretion.

Pony Equitation Class. Open to juniors mounted on ponies. The judges will select at least one-fourth of the class to show at a walk, trot, and canter and to perform additional tests at the judge's discretion.

Pleasure Classes are restricted to ponies and horses that do not show in classes where the performance of the pony or horse counts other than in Pleasure. Pleasure Hack consists of W/T/C and asked to jump two fences at the end of no higher than 2'

Western Class descriptions:

Western Pleasure Classes. Contestants compete simultaneously, traveling the perimeter of the arena, and at the discretion of the judge, are asked to walk, jog, lope and reverse the direction of the horse. Horses are evaluated on quality of movement while staying quiet and calm, traveling on a loose rein. Young Entry riders are 13 and under, Junior riders are 14 - 17, and Senior riders are 18 and over.

Games Classes. Are timed events where an exhibitor may enter one or more horses in a class, but each horse may have only one rider per class. Regular barrels where exhibitors follow a course consisting of three barrels in triangular "cloverleaf" pattern. Riders choose to circle either the right or left barrel first, race to the opposite barrel and complete the course after circling the third barrel and racing down the center of the three barrels to stop the timer. Knocking over a barrel carries a five second penalty. Speed barrel consists of one barrel. Texas barrels consist of 3 barrels in a row ridden like pole bending. In Pole Bending the speed and agility of the horse are tested as horse and rider weave through a course of six poles spaced 21 feet apart, twice circling end poles before turning and racing to the finish line. The pattern must be followed exactly. A five-second penalty is added for each pole knocked down. Must have at least 6 in the class for payout. **Payback 10/5/3/2**

Awards:

Six ribbons will be awarded in each class with the exception of payback classes.
